- Bachelor's and Master's degree, at least one of the two in a related discipline (such as, but by no means limited to urban studies, architecture, urban planning or urban geography), from a reputable undergraduate programme with excellent academic performance.
- · Statement of Purpose, up to 1500 words
- Research Proposal, up to 2500 words
- At least two Referral/Recommendation letters
